PURPOSE

This policy will provide guidelines for the engagement and participation of volunteers, placements, work experience and students at Aurora School Community Kindergarten and Aurora School, while ensuring that children's health, safety and wellbeing is protected at all times.



POLICY STATEMENT

VALUES

Aurora School Community Kindergarten and Aurora School is committed to:

- supporting connections with educational institutions to provide opportunities for students to undertake practicum placements as part of their studies
- building relationships with community members and providing suitable opportunities to
 engage volunteers to contribute to the programs and activities of the service
- ensuring the health, safety and wellbeing of each child at the service through consistent compliance with this policy and procedures when engaging volunteers and students.
- building connections with local schools and schools that support Deaf children to provide opportunities to support work experience students

SCOPE

This policy applies to the approved provider, persons with management or control, nominated supervisor, persons in day-to-day charge, early childhood teachers, educators, staff, students, volunteers, parents/guardians, children, and others attending the programs and activities of Aurora School Community Kindergarten and Aurora School, including during offsite excursions and activities.

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BACKGROUND AND LEGISLATION

BACKGROUND

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Students from tertiary organisations may participate in programs and activities at the service from time to time including observing and experiencing the provision of centre-based education and care. This will be encouraged and facilitated by Aurora School Community Kindergarten and Aurora School wherever appropriate and possible.

Aurora School Community Kindergarten and Aurora School values the participation of parents/guardians and other family members, and the voluntary contribution they make to the education and care of their own and other children. "In genuine partnerships families and educators value each other's knowledge and roles, communicate freely and respectfully and engage in shared decision making" (Early Years Learning Framework – *refer to Sources*).

Aurora School Community Kindergarten and Aurora School aims to provide a range of opportunities for family members, volunteers and students to participate in programs and activities while adhering to clear guidelines regarding appropriate interactions and communication with staff, and other adults and children at the service (refer to Code of Conduct Policy).

The role that volunteers and students play in education and care services varies and can include working with groups of children, preparing materials, assisting with administrative tasks or working one-on-one with individual children. The service is responsible for ensuring that volunteers and students are suitable to work with children, and that children's health, safety and wellbeing is protected at all times. This may differ in Allied Health roles and Auslan students.

Volunteers and placement students should only be engaged to complement, not replace, the work of paid staff. Accordingly, services should not engage volunteers to fill the place of an employee who is ill or on leave, or to fill a vacant budgeted position.

Volunteers and placement students must not be asked to perform tasks:

- that they are untrained, unqualified or too inexperienced to undertake
- that put the children or themselves in a vulnerable or potentially unsafe situation
- where there is a conflict of interest.

Prior to participation at the service, a volunteer or student (aged 18 years or over) must be in possession of a Working with Children (WWC) Clearance (*refer to Definitions*).

Community Kindergarten only

Parents/guardians whose children usually attend the Community Kindergarten service are exempt from needing a WWC Check *(refer to Definitions)*. However, a service may decide, as a demonstration of duty of care, that all parents/guardians who volunteer at the service are required to undergo a WWC Check *(refer to Definitions)*.

Aurora School only

Parents/guardians whose children usually attend the service are exempt from needing a WWC Check (*refer to Definitions*) if they spend time in the room with their children. However, parents that volunteer in a different room (ie: not in their child's room) are required to provide a current WWC Check (*refer to Definitions*).

In line with Child Safe Standard 4 and the *Child Safe Environment Policy*, prior to engaging a volunteer or student an assessment should be undertaken of the nature of the responsibility to determine whether a position description is required and based on that whether an interview and referee checks are required.

DEFINITIONS

The terms defined in this section relate specifically to this policy. For regularly used terms e.g. Approved provider, Nominated supervisor, Notifiable complaints, Serious incidents, Duty of care, etc. refer to the Definitions file of the PolicyWorks catalogue.

Child-connected work (Aurora School): work authorised by the governing school authority/provider and performed by an adult in a school or on a school premise while children are present or expected to be present.

Child-related work or relation to the WWC Check *(refer to Definitions)*, child-related work includes work with children which may involve physical contact, face-to-face contact, oral, written or electronic communication.

Conflict of interest: (In relation to this policy) refers to an interest that may affect, or may appear reasonably likely to affect, the judgement or conduct of the volunteer, or may impair their independence or loyalty to the service. A conflict of interest can arise from avoiding personal losses as well as gaining personal advantage, whether financial or otherwise, and may not only involve the volunteer, but also their relatives, friends or business associates

Student (in CK): A person undertaking a practicum placement as part of a recognised early childhood qualification. This student will be supported by an educational institution in the completion of their placement.

Student (in Aurora School): A person undertaking a practicum placement as part of a recognised Teacher of the Deaf or Allied Health qualification. This student will be supported by a suitably qualified Aurora School Professional.

Volunteer: A person or parent (who's child attends the service) who willingly undertakes defined activities to support the education and care programs at a service in an unpaid or honorary capacity. These activities may include child-related work *(refer to Definitions)*, administrative tasks, or preparing materials or food.

School Work means:

- Carrying out the functions of the school council or Kindergarten Director
 - Any activity carried out for the welfare of a school, by the school council, any parents' club or association or any other body organised to promote the welfare of the school
 - Any activity carried out for the welfare of the school at the request of the principal or school council or Kindergarten Director
 - Providing assistance in the work of any school or kindergarten
 - Attending meetings in relation to government schools convened by any organisation which receives government financial support

- regularly seek feedback from everyone affected by the policy regarding its effectiveness
- monitor the implementation, compliance, complaints and incidents in relation to this policy
- keep the policy up to date with current legislation, research, policy and best practice
- revise the policy and procedures as part of the service's policy review cycle, or as required
- notifying all stakeholders affected by this policy at least 14 days before making any significant changes to this policy or its procedures, unless a lesser period is necessary due to risk (*Regulation 172 (2)*).
